

Answering the Call

Ray & Ken at Vic. Falls, 2011

We are pleased to announce that Ray Warwick, a Christian Education Project Director for Equipping Leaders International, (ELI), has accepted the call to serve with ACU. He first traveled to Africa to teach with ELI in 2006. On that trip He was struck by the intense zeal of the Christians there, seeking, solid teaching from the Word of God. "I was deeply impressed by the joyous reaction of the people when they were introduced to biblical truth which they hadn't heard before," he said. "These brothers and sisters were hungry to feed upon the Word, and they were starving for solid teaching." He had never known a more receptive group of "students." Numerous trips to Africa since then, has confirmed his sense that our African friends are sincerely longing for substantial biblical instruction, but are being bombarded with all manner of faulty teaching and erroneous doctrines. Ray is especially excited to see how God, in His grace, has raised up the Zambian Reformed Baptist churches to meet this need. He believes that this is

a crucial time for God's kingdom work in Africa. Following the revival God has initiated through the Zambian churches, educati

Zambian churches, education that assists the church in discipleship is critical for continued kingdom impact across Africa.

From the moment He met Ken Turnbull and learned of the vision for African Christian University, Ray believed it was an answer to prayer for all our African brethren, and knew he wanted to be a part of it. "When Ken bid me to serve on the ACU-USA Board of Directors, I was humbled and thrilled," explained Ray, "but when

he asked me to praverfully consider joining him in Zambia to assist in the development of the university, my world was suddenly shaken." Rav's wife of 37 years, Peggy, as well as other family members. (three grown children), immediately saw this as God's call upon his life: however, he needed to process things more slowly. Yet with the passing of time, much prayer, and through many discussions with Dr. Turnbull and others. God confirmed to him that the entire sum of his

30 year career (MA in Education, BA in Bible) and life experiences as a Christian educator, both in the US and abroad, have been preparing him for this exciting ministry.

While visiting Zambia in the summer of 2011 and meeting the dear saints in Lusaka, Ray began to savor God's amazing work there, and acquired a genuine desire to be a fellow-laborer in this great undertaking.

"I am convinced that the epicenter of Christendom is shifting away from the naturalistic, secular west," Ray surmised. "Clearly, Africa and Asia are ground zero in the cosmic spiritual battle for the expansion of the Church of Jesus Christ, and the spread of His Kingdom on this earth." Many Christian leaders recognize the great need in Africa for the training and development of indigenous leaders who are grounded in Scripture, and equipped to impact culture for the glory of God and the good of His people. Ray wholeheartedly agrees with the nucleus of godly pastors and lay-leaders in Lusaka, Zambia, that African Christian University will play a significant role in evangelism, discipleship and Kingdom advancement across Africa, and he is persuaded that the vision will be perpetuated through its robust Christ-centered, biblically-based worldview.

"As an educator, I know full-well the profound influence teachers have on the generations," Ray affirmed, "and I'm thrilled to have been asked to minister at ACU as Academic Dean, taking a lead role in faculty and academic program development." He envisions that as God answers prayer and blesses ACU, it will become a fertile training ground for future Christian leaders who will infiltrate their communities and impact the culture with gospel truth.

Dr. Ken Turnbull shared, "Ray is truly gifted as a teacher, or more specifically, as a mentor - one who can seamlessly incorporate his Biblical worldview into any subject matter while exemplifying his maturing Christ-likeness and personally edifying his learners and colleagues."

Pastor, John Leeder of Pacific Hope Church in San Diego, CA, also highly recommended the Warwick's, citing their fervent service as active members, and noting how deeply their absence would be felt. participate in the 425 Campaign.


