His desire is to add value to the Christian community while passing onto successive generations a legacy of truth and the many lessons he has learned in the mission/development field. He endeavors with a lively hope, to build leaders in a post-modern context. Gladly bearing the title of "prayer warrior" on behalf of ACU, Billy asks God for the provision of much grace and that from the outset, "the university would be set on solid rails... that being the Solid Rock." He expresses deep confidence in the outcome and encourages full support of the project from the global community. To that end, Dr. Sichone contributed a favorite quote from William Carey... "Attempt great things for God and expect great things from him!"
